

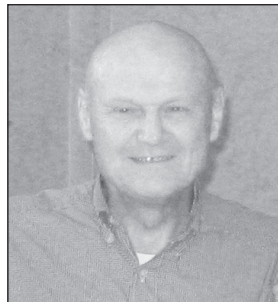

Gerald "Gary" Allen Youso, of Kekoskee, Wis., passed away on Jan. 6, 2018 surrounded by family and friends after having faced cancer with unparalleled grace and endurance.

Born in Foley on Feb. 17, 1945, Gary attended St. John's Preparatory School and St. John's University, where he earned his bachelor's degrees in history and languages. He played college football and baseball, and was a standout linebacker on the 1963
